
Please continue to collect glasses, support CLERC and US counterparts in sorting and cleaning, and if you can arrange some vision screening events in schools, that would be great!

Each Club will have a Global Leadership Team (GLT) Chairperson namely the current First Vice President, Global Service Team (GST) Chairperson namely a current Club Director and Global Membership Team (GMT) Chairperson namely the Club Membership Director.

Each of these positions must implement an action plan for success, measure the success, report the success and celebrate the success. LCI does have a toolbox for each of these positions within the Lions Club, District and Multiple Districts. Each of these positions are in communication with each other and the District Counterparts. 

Lions Quest is a school-based program that teaches 32 important life skills to children from Preschool to Grade 12. We train the Educators who teach the Children!! We supply them the Curriculum Grade Level Material & Resources that they need through the school year. Our program also includes the Community folks who are connected to youth ie: Police, Youth Worker, before & after school Educators, Scouts, Youth Coaches...

From VDG Michael Stanford - Chairman of the Board For Lions Quest Canada,

I am challenging Lions Clubs within District 19-I to help support Lions Quest Canada by purchasing a Q Bear Fan Club Membership, which costs \$100.00. The Membership can be for the Lions Club, or recognizing a Lion within their

Club or the best way is to recognize a Community Leader (Educator, Youth Worker, Scout Leader, Police School Liaison Officer...) outside your Lions Club. Since Lions Quest Canada is a registered charity with Canada Revenue Agency, an individual can donate, become a Q Bear Fan & receive a Tax Donation Receipt.

Last fiscal year (2021-2022), it was extremely difficult to operate Lions Quest Canada with very limited funds. Out of 1345 Lions Clubs within Canada, Lions Quest Canada received a total of \$79,611.00 in donations. Only 156 Lions Clubs donated to LQC which is 11.6% Canadian Lions Clubs supporting us. Within British Columbia, we have a total of 192 Lions Clubs. Only 22 Lions Clubs supported LQC, which is 11.5% of the British Columbia Lions Clubs. Our expected donations from Lions Clubs is \$165,000.00 per year. In the past, we made the goal or exceeded it.

Every year, Lions Quest Canada has been asking Lions Clubs to budget \$500 for Lions Quest Programs. The ASK is for direct financial assistance to Lions Quest Canada and for supporting Lions Quest Programs within our Districts. There is nothing wrong with giving more! Lions Quest Canada does return back and works within our District. February 2022, we trained 20 Educators on Gabriola Island, and held a Lions Quest Community Partnership Rally at the District Spring Convention. Also, we are working with the University of Victoria.

As you know we are the only Social Emotional Learning Program that includes the Community. It is a very successful program that has been proven and is award winning. We got to keep our program alive by making financial contributions. It is not a free program. This program will only exist with the financial assistance from Lions Clubs. Our Communities need mental health assistance, which Lions Quest can assist the Educator, Youth Worker or any person directly involved with youth.

Please can you do a small step more to assist Lions Quest Canada? Can you accept the challenge? Can you do it now and not wait until then end of the year? Can you send me an email and let me know your Lions Club will help out? My Email Address for the District ~ lionmichaelvdg19i@icloud.com

I am inviting you to be a big part of Lions Quest. Lastly, I have a few Lions that volunteered to be part of our District Lions Quest Committee. Camp Shawnigan Improvement Committee

HELLO TO ALL OF THE MEMBERS OF THE LIONS CLUBS OF VANCOUVER ISLAND. WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU!!!

The Committee for the Improvement of the Shawnigan Lake Easter Seals Camp wants to let you know that BCLS has decided to close the Shawnigan Lake Camp this summer. The decision to close the camp was communicated to us on July 6th. The reason for the closure is that the infrastructure, specifically the septic system is not in working order and will not be able to serve the needs of the campers. After so much discussion about this septic system going back several years, and an engineering report in April 2019 finding

the system in major disrepair, requiring \$15,500.00 worth of work, this was no surprise. Although we agree with the decision, it was very disappointing given that volunteers gave their time to work on the Camp, and the members from the Malahat Lions Club spent hours there, week after week starting in May, painting, cutting grass, weed whacking, power washing stairs and pathways, raking and building fences and repairing decks and railings. In fact, our committee was surprised that the BCLS had planned to run the Camp this year, given its overall condition. Clearly maintenance had not been done for a long time. The pool was dark green and had to be emptied, cleaned, and refilled. The pump and filter were not working. A lot of work had to be done. Just as we were finishing our list of things to do, we received the news that the Camp would not open! Families were notified and given the option to place their children in other camps. According to BCLS, this has worked out and many of the campers will go to Winfield.

BCLS has indicated that the camp will open next year if the septic system has been replaced. The work will begin soon, and it will conform to the new system that will be necessary for the new facilities that they hope to build on the grounds within the next few years. Unfortunately, our committee who has been actively on the site for months now, cannot see the Camp opening even with a new septic system because the cafeteria is falling apart, and the other buildings need much work. The roof on the cafeteria has not been maintained and now has leaks, and the ceiling and walls are crumbling. All the buildings are in serious disrepair, needing scraping and painting inside and out. There are too many issues to describe them all here. In our opinion, another year of no maintenance and the Camp will not be usable. However, we have been told by the BCLS that we are not to do any further maintenance at the Camp other than cutting the grass and weed eating! They are closing off the water and there is no septic system. We are extremely concerned. Should the Camp be shut till the new facilities are built, (3-4 years from now...maybe?) we lose an enormous asset on the Island for families with disabled children, we take a chance that the new facilities are never built, then what? and we could lose a particularly important service that for 47 years has been a major Flag Ship of the Lions Clubs. **What to do?**

Although it appears that the founding Lions Clubs wanted to ensure that the Lions Clubs always have a part to play in the Society's business, by creating a Board of Directors that must have 50% representation from Lions Club members, our clubs do not seem to have a voice in the affairs of the Society. How did this happen? Can we and should we do something about this?

Here is our dilemma. Do we have support from the Island Lions Clubs to assert ourselves and say.... Enough is Enough! The question I am left with, is: Are the Island Lions Clubs at all interested in renewing their support of the Camp and becoming involved in a Camp Wellness Program? **Do they still care?**

If not, if we don't have at least 10 to 15 Clubs on the Island willing to voice their concerns over the handling of the Camp and its maintenance, and take on a role in the Camp's well being, then I guess we accept the status quo and move on.

I would like to hear from the Island Clubs, members, and executives as to the current position of your Clubs on the issues of the Shawnigan Lake, Easter Seals Camp.

There are several uniquely Canadian initiatives. I will list these below, but the highlights this year were a new Memorandum of Understanding signed between us and Special Olympics. We will be on the search for "Champion Clubs" to support this cause. There are currently 32 Districts in Canada, and we are hoping more will make grant applications, specifically around Disaster Preparedness (earthquake, flood, tsunami, disease) as we still have over \$60,000 in Centennial Grants still unused. Of course we should be applying for every grant possible!

The search is on for Lions to attend our federal Houses of Parliament for Lions Day on the Hill in Ottawa this November (brrrrr). If you can get to Ottawa, then all expenses are paid for hotel, meals, transportation. There will be some training opportunities, as well, beforehand. For the rest of us, it is important to establish connections with MPs to remind them of the significant contribution Lions are making to their communities. Invite them to your events and meetings. Send them a copy of your District and Zone newsletters, and while you are at it, include your MLA, your local Mayors and Council, Area Directors, and all elected officials. We make a difference, and as we heard a million times last week, "Together We Can!". Our International President wants us to ROAR and be known in our communities to every elected and responsible person possible.


