Our Cabinet meeting this month was in Qualicum Bay, and I was so honoured to have five of our seven Zone Chairs attend, as well as people from many Cabinet posts and Committees provide insight to our District's operations. We were thrilled to be able to review the three top contenders for the Peace Poster Contest and agree that the prize money could be increased! I'll be taking the top entry to Bellingham for judging at the Multiple District level. A huge shout out to Jim Hodgkins of the Victoria Lions for his super human efforts on this Lions Contest over the past 30 years. Jim has done so much to educate kids and teachers about Peace, and holding up our dreams for Leading With Compassion. 



Type 2 Diabetes Screening

Did you know that type 2 diabetes accounts for 90% of all diabetes cases worldwide? In fact, approximately 374 million people are at risk of developing type 2 diabetes. Lions can help reduce these numbers by organizing



type 2 diabetes screening events in their communities.

Type 2 diabetes screening is an important way to help individuals understand their risk while also making our communities healthier. In the short term, screenings help community members learn about diabetes and understand their current health status. If necessary, they can also be referred for care. All of this leads to an overall improved quality of life.

What is a type 2 diabetes screening event?

A type 2 diabetes screening event provides community members with type 2 diabetes education, awareness and screening services, including referral services. Lions clubs work with medical professionals and other community partners to determine screening methods and any necessary equipment.

Did you know during 2019-2020 Lions and Leos conducted nearly 5,600 type 2 diabetes risk awareness and screening events?





December 1: Postmark deadline for a club not belonging to a district to send one winning entry to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.

December 15: Postmark deadline for the MD council chairperson to send one winning poster to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.

February 1: International winners notified on or before this date.

Sequim Valley Lions


