



My name is Lorne Bunyan, and I am the District Coordinator for 19-I for the Lions Clubs International Foundation. My home Club is the Saltspring Island Lions Club and I have been a Lion for the past 15 years. In addition to being your Foundation coordinator, I am the Immediate Past District Governor for District 19-I. Sad to say, this will be the last 6-months that we will be known as District 19-I as we transition to District 19-L in our newly realigned Multiple District.

I want to look back at our last year and the outstanding accomplishments of our Clubs in helping to bring Campaign 100 to a successful completion. If you were in Montreal for our International Convention, you will remember the excitement when it was revealed that the world of Lions had accomplished the goal of Campaign 100 by surpassing the intended mark of \$300 Million dollars. Globally we raised over \$325,400,000 US Dollars. (Please read the *LCIF NEWSLETTER* included in this month's DG'S Newsletter - Pg 24) Wow and thank you District 19-I for your contributions!

Last year my goal was 100% Club participation, hoping to achieve \$30,000 in contributions. Thirty-five of the 48 Clubs (72.92%) took up the challenge. I didn't achieve 100% but what a great contribution our District made going from \$21,500 to \$57,400, almost doubling my goal as District Governor! What an effort! A big thank you goes to PDG Michael Dukes for organizing and facilitating contributions on the USA side. And huge thanks to all the Zone Chairs, Presidents and LCIF Club coordinators for their outstanding efforts in bringing Campaign 100 to such a fabulous conclusion. Our Multiple District <u>led the nation</u> in Canadian donations raising the equivalent of \$179 per member (USA) within our Multiple District. Well Done District Governor's of 2021-2022, MD 19 is a shining example of service to all. I'm so very proud of district 19-I and all of you.

What's next for 2022-2023? Glad you asked. How about we continue to try to reach 100% at the Club level and improve from 35 Clubs to all 48 Clubs as a <u>"Tribute to our last year as District 19-</u><u>I"</u>? In addition, lets look at individual donations and increase our personal commitments by giving up a cup of coffee per week and donate that money to: Lions of Canada Fund for LCIF and send the \$10 per month to PDG Stan Durward at Box 38, Sunderland, Ontario LOC 1CO.

This achievement, for me personally, reflects how Lions, when working together, can achieve so much.

Coping with Diabetes at Christmas or any Special Occasion



Tips on What to Do if You Are Type 2 diabetic. It can be harder to control over the Christmas period, when it's easy to be tempted to over-indulging in festive treats. Follow these dos and don'ts to control your



blood sugar levels.

DO check you have enough medication and blood glucose monitoring supplies to see you through the holiday period. **DO** plan well in advance rather than leaving things last minute. Christmas can be a stressful time and excess stress can cause glucose levels to rise.

DO talk to your doctor in advance so you know what to do if your readings are raised over Christmas.

DO make healthy diet swaps, by swapping traditional favourites with healthier versions.

For example, swap foggy pudding with fresh fig compote, or swap double cream with low-fat creme fraiche. **DO** go for a walk after eating heavy meals, to help burn off the extra calories.

DO eat nuts - a popular Christmas snack that help lower cholesterol, blood pressure and help control glucose levels. **DON'T** overindulge on Christmas cake, pudding, mince pies and chocolate.

Spread them out rather than overindulging at one sitting – graze rather than gorge. For example, wait a couple of hours after your Christmas main course before having dessert," said Dr Brewer.

DON'T forget to check glucose levels, as they are more likely to rise if you are eating more, being less active and experiencing a change in routine.

DON'T neglect your eating habits if your routine changes. Eat dinner earlier if need be and check what food arrangements are in place when going to events.

DON'T drink too much alcohol, as this can make you less aware of the symptoms of low blood sugar.

Alternate an alcoholic drink with a non-alcoholic beverage, and instead of drinking wine on its own, add soda water to make a spritzer. When drinking spirits, always add a low calorie or diet mixer rather than one containing sugar.


